Dear Father, I was wondering... What is going on with our seminarians these days? Dear Friend, Thank you for your great question. We presently have ten men studying to be priests from New Hampshire. Most of them attend St Meinrad seminary in Indiana. They are all at different stages of preparation. The college seminary years are now called years of discipleship. The first year of seminary is now called the propaedeutic year. It is a year of prayer and discernment. The major seminary years are called years of configuration. Then there is a pastoral year, when the candidate gets experience in a parish. This is followed by the fourth year of configuration followed by Diaconate ordination and a final year of studies leading to priesthood ordination.

Way back in my day, we had pre theology studies in philosophy, and then four years of theology. I also worked in a parish as a seminarian. We pray for our seminarians, and for vocations to the priesthood, diaconate, and Religious Life. Do you know someone who may have a vocation to religious life? Let us pray for them, and encourage them to pursue God's call. It would be great to have a parish seminarian.

CEMETERY INFORMATION We are blessed to have our two parish cemeteries. Cemeteries are sacred places to pray for, and remember, our dead. We are able to bury full bodies and cremains. Our cemeteries are witnesses to everlasting life. We treat our beloved dead with the greatest respect and love. We recommend having a wake, funeral Mass, and burial when a person dies. Cremains are to be buried in consecrated ground. They are not to be

kept on the mantle, or put in jewelry, and they are not to be scattered around. The price of the burial includes perpetual care of the body and of the cemetery grounds. Burial of the dead is a corporal work of mercy, and praying for the dead is a spiritual work of mercy.

MISSION HELP Father Sebastian, the pastor of St Mary's parish in Claremont, is leading an effort to get new donated clothing and new bedsheets. These items will be shipped to Papua, New Guinea to help with the Mission there, which is led by the local Bishop, who belongs to the Heralds of the Good News order.
